

Remembering A Bull Named Oscar.

In Oscar's first five years as a bucking bull, more than 100 cowboys tried to ride him and every one of them failed to last eight seconds. Oscar became such a challenge that owners RSC (Rodeo Stock Contractors) offered a bronze "Oscar" to the first man to ride him. Oscar, unlike many great bucking bulls, was small, weighing about 1,300 pounds. His bucking style was characterized by a violent spin to the left. Only a handful of cowboys made an eight-second ride on Oscar, among them John Davis, Randy Magers, Jerome Robinson, Allan Jordan, Guy Barth and Don Gay.
